When Almitra was 19 she made a deal with her Ma. She needed to leave Pakistan to have the future in theatre she wanted. The two things stopping her? Her unique passport... and bloody Canada. In this autobiographical show, with all original music, Almitra shares her story of displacement, racial profiling, and visa rejections. A heartwarming tale of borders and belonging, *Blacklisted* takes you from the rooftops of Karachi to the soft sands of Coogee, drawing musical inspiration from Queen, The Eagles, *Hamilton*, South Asian orchestral music, blues and jazz, with cultural instrumentations including the sitaar and tabla/percussion.

Three bodies interweave movement, memory and vocal roulette. As we recall the firsts that shape us, unpick experiences that get under our skin, and encounter delicate conversations between our bodies, *idk* encourages exploration of the unsure and unspoken in human interaction. What do our bodies remember and hold? When are we in or out of control? How do we reconcile desire and shame, fear and fantasy, self and others, yes no maybe and I don't know?


