At 96, Uncle Wes is committed to sharing the ancient knowledge of his grandfather's creation and dreaming stories, and his personal experiences of his life as a Bigambul man over the last century.

Following the successful sold out Sydney Festival 2016 premier of *Fire Bucket* and subsequent sold out seasons at Yirramboi First Nations Arts Festival and Way Out West Childrens Festival, Uncle Wes wants to start taking his stories home to Stanthorpe, Queensland – but not without a few stops along the way... ABOUT THE PROJECT

Forge is a metaphor for the human soul that is beaten and shaped through life. Evoking the blacksmith's iron furnace, Forge recasts soulful flamenco through contemporary dance and the percussive power of the piano. Fragments of memory are revealed through Lorca's poetry, a pentagram, ancient voices, and images of civil war inspired by Picasso's Guernica.

Described by one audience member as 'a place of worship', this solo performance commands introspection. This is a universal human story celebrating visibility of the mature woman in search of self, and as a metaphor for embracing complexity and diversity within contemporary Australia. It reaches out to audiences from newly arrived and diverse communities, all ages and socio-economic backgrounds.

ABOUT THE COMPANY

Annalouise Paul is a dance maker and performer whose choreographic works explore identity and transformation through the intersection of traditional and contemporary dance. 



Working with the dhol — a traditional Indian barrel drum, and the trital — a rigid rhythmic structure built around four measures of four beats each. Dhol-master Maharshi Raval and three diverse performers will test notions of movement and speed against stasis and exhaustion, challenging traditional notions of order in Indian dance by changing the relationship between the dhol player and the dancers. Traditional Kathak dance involves the drum leading the dancers, but this work switches that around and up-ends this idea with the dancers rebelling against the power of the dhol.
